

## Creating your Poster

To provide the best experience, review this document to prepare your poster.

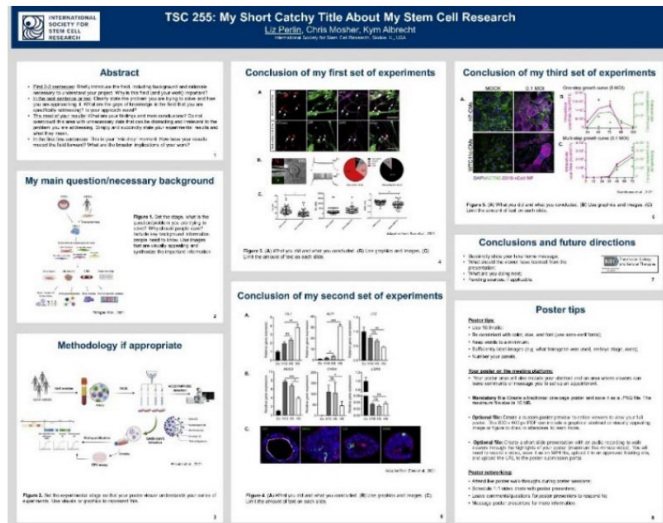
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**Create your Poster:** Physical Poster **REQUIRED** for in-person poster presenters.

Use these instructions and guidelines for designing a poster that visually presents your research or clinical project. Structure your poster similarly to a research paper or journal article.

- Brief sections: introduction (rationale or review of relevant research), methods, results, conclusion/summary, and key references list
- Use images, charts, diagrams, etc., with limited text to attract attention.

### Example:



**IMPORTANT:** Posters **must** fit in a one (1) meter by one (1) meter space. We recommend the standard size A1 in landscape orientation (which is 33 1/8 x 23 3/8 inches) because this will fit in the meter width and because landscape works best for attendees who don't have to stoop down to see the lower parts of a poster. If printing your poster in Cincinnati, you must make your own arrangements. ISSCR does not handle poster printing.

- Use 36-point type for section headings and 24-point type for text is recommended for easy reading.
- Pins will be provided onsite to attach your posters to the poster boards
- Print on a single sheet for easy transportation
- Due to fire regulations, no tables, chairs, or electrical hook-ups will be allowed near the posters.
